Part A :

What is the plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards quality enhancement & what is the outcome by the end of the year ?

Internal Quality Assurance Cell of the college met on 24th April, 2007. Resolutions in the form of following suggestions were passed. The members took notice of the inferences drawn from the feed back obtained from the students with the help of a questionnaire & feed back received through two suggestion boxes installed in the college.

1. Members strongly recommended that the teaching staff should be encouraged & persuaded to put to optimum use the teaching aids in the class room.
2. The college should arrange to have a web site immediately & relevant information as required under NAAC guidelines be displayed.
3. Various Committees should be encouraged to take up programmes that can inculcate desirable social & cultural values in the students. The members suggested that students can visit old age home & interact with deserted old people. This shall rekindle fast dwindling family bonds among the students. The students can be encouraged to offer few days service at such centers preferably during vacations.
4. The college should introduce various programmes that can identify & hone various competencies among the students.

5. Another recommendation made by the committee was that sense of care for the environment should be strongly evoked among the students. They need to be sensitized.
6. Socio-economic survey of Khedi village was undertaken in the year 2001. Some corrective measures based on the outcome of the survey were taken in the subsequent years. The member suggested that yet another survey be undertaken so as to note any improvement in the condition of the people.
7. Members recommended that since all Science Departments have been provided with computers, they should undertake computerization of their respective departmental information.
8. In the light of boom in Shopping Malls, members recommended that short term retail management course be introduced.
9. The members recommended that in the light of changing scenario the management should prepare a Master Plan for coming few years projecting as to how the challenge, in particular regarding infrastructure, would be faced.
10. The registration of alumni be revived. The association be strengthened. To reach the alumni, advertisement in news papers be put in.
11. Although graduation is an under qualification for placement yet placement cell can look for some jobs like Receptionists, Bank Clerks etc. that suits the qualification of the students.
12. The members unanimously recommended that all stake holders viz. Teachers & Non teaching staff should be computer literate. To identify the members of Teaching & Non teaching staff who need improvement, a questionnaire be prepared for the purpose. The staff so identified be made to undertake a brief course in computers.

13. As per the feed back from teachers it has come to light that students do not willingly undertake projects that were introduced a few years back since these do not carry any weight by way of marks. The members recommended that students be persuaded and projects of preliminary nature be introduced that do not interfere in the regular learning of the students. The projects may be more of a hobby type that will help the students to improve their writing skills, let them handle computer etc.
14. Members desired that some teachers from the college be deputed to some other institutions so as to have a first hand information about various matters like infrastructure & its optimum use, innovative methods employed in teaching, good administrative measures, management of the institution, functioning of the office, library set up etc.
15. As regards maintenance of the sanitation & cleanliness in the college, the members recommended involvement of external agency on contract basis.
16. To keep up the tempo in the students, women entrepreneurs should be regularly invited to the college & made to interact with students. This will sow the seeds of entrepreneurial bent of mind.
17. Based on the outcome of the students' feed back increased numbers of copies of news papers should be made available to the students in the reading rooms.
18. To improve the services rendered by the Non teaching staff some experts be invited & a workshop on work culture be conducted for the benefit of the said staff.

Action initiated on the suggestions made by IQAC is as follows :

1. A web-site of the college has been launched. All relevant information has been put on the site. Some sections are in the process of improvement / modification.
2. Science Departments have henceforth started putting relevant departmental information on the computers.
3. Placement Cell has been composed from among the teachers. Its activity has began. In the last session a modest number of 06 students could find employment in various agencies through the placement cell.
4. Maintenance of sanitation & cleanliness in the college has been entrusted to an external agency on contract basis from this year.
5. Psychology Department has already prepared a plan & workshop for non teaching staff shall be conducted in the coming session so as to improve the work culture.
6. A good number of women entrepreneurs were invited to the college this year who interacted with the students.

Part B :

1. Activities reflecting the goals & objectives of the institution :

The following activities were undertaken in the academic year 2007-2008. These go in tune with the objective of the institution.

- i. N.S.S students, besides their regular activities and camps, concentrated on environment related activities . The students adopted a village on the eve of “Ganesh Festival” and vehemently explained to the folks the hazards of preparing Ganesh idols using Plaster of Paris and poisonous synthetic dyes and their subsequent emersion in water bodies in the village.The villagers were persuaded to use clay for the purpose.Besides the villagers were educated regarding disposal of “ Nirmalya” produced as a result of the worship on the occasion.
- ii. Another significant activity by the NSS students was to have a rally on the eve of “AIDS day” in village Takarkheda and enact street plays on the way to send across a message. AIDS awareness programme was also held in the college by NSS with the help of authorities from Civil Hospital, Jalgaon.
- iii. NCC students continued to have their regular parades, camps and celebrations. Besides some students showed promising results on other fronts like participation in Thal Sainik Camp,National Integration Camp,Group Selection Training Camp, Inter Group Competition DTE Selection Camps, RD group Selection Camp etc. Our NCC cadets flourished on other fronts too. 08 students passed “B” certificate examination and 07 cadets passed “C” certificate examination.
- iv. Besides, many activities by the Art Circle, Debating Club, Spoken English Course, Computer Literacy & Internet Course all together help the institution in fulfilling our goal.

- v. Questionnaires were got filled up by parents to gather information about their assessment regarding various functions of the college through their interaction with their wards. Besides gathering of the parents of our students was arranged & a fruitful interaction took place. Analysis of the feedback was done & the information that surfaced was presented before the management.
- vi. 'Certificate course in spoken English' & 'Computer Literacy & Internet Course' were continued to be conducted this year as well. This is open to all desirous students from all faculties.
- vii. Annual Social Gathering & the welcome party continue to be a star attraction & do a lot of good to the student community. Both these events are fully managed by the students without any flaw.
- viii. Feed back about all the aspects concerning the students in the college including their teachers, continues to be taken. This has helped the system to remain healthy & grow.

2. New academic programmes initiated (UG & PG) :

Post Graduate Courses in Economics, Computer Science & Commerce have been introduced from this session.

3. Innovations in curricular design and transaction :

Being an affiliated college, the curriculum is framed by the university. However, our college teachers regularly participate in syllabus framing workshops whenever conducted by the university. North Maharashtra University revises the syllabi every 05 years. The last revision was completed in the academic session 2003-04. Our college teachers regularly participate in the process in almost all the subjects. In this session the university undertook the revision of syllabi for Second year B.A.; B. Sc.; B. Com. Courses.

7. Total number of seminars / workshops conducted :

A state level three days sensitization programme on "Eradicating Violence against women-Strengthening Human Rights" was organized by the college from Oct. 25-27, 2007. The programme was sponsored by U. G. C., New Delhi. The target groups identified were social & youth welfare officer's, experts from visual & print media, health personnel, tribal welfare officers, some N. G. Os. & teachers

During the course of the programme well known scholars in the field of Sociology, Psychology, Judiciary & medicine delivered lectures & interactivity with the participants. The idea of the programme was to sensitize various enforcement agencies. Besides, the three days programme was widely covered by the local press. This served the purpose of the programme to create awareness in the society at large.

One day University Level Seminar on the theme “Decline in Ethical Values & Role of Educational Institutions” was conducted by this institution on Jan. 25, 2008. The seminar was partially sponsored by B. C. U. D. North Maharashtra University, Jalgaon. The expected outcome of the seminar was identification of measures regarding the methodology to be adopted by Educational Institutions for Imparting Value Education to students. The participants included the teaching faculty of this college & some teaching faculty members from various colleges in this University Jurisdiction. 24 papers on various aspects of the theme were presented during the seminar.

17. Community Services :

“Extension activities committee” framed for the purpose looks after this aspect with the cooperation of N.S.S. volunteers & N. C. C. cadets.

A tree plantation programme was undertaken on Aug. 25, 2007 in Tarsod, a village on the periphery of Jalgaon town.

An awareness programme regarding adverse effects of water & sound pollution on the eve of Ganesh Festival was organized in Tarsod Village on Sept. 10, 2007. The villagers were educated about ill-effects of submersion of Ganesh Idols made of plaster of paris & were persuaded to use clay for the purpose.

On the eve of Mahatma Gandhi Jayanti falling on Oct. 02, 2007, an awareness programme about the ill-effects of open latrines on public health was undertaken in Tarsod Village. Both teachers & students participated. Information was provided about construction of low cost latrines.

A medical check up camp was organized for the villagers and students of a local school in Tarsod Village on Jan. 21, 2008. The camp had a good response.

On the eve of world AIDS prevention week, on Dec. 13, 2007, street plays were presented at some spots in the village for the benefit of the villagers. Dr. Nitin Bharambe & Prof. Rajinder Gadgil presented slide shows on AIDS to the village folk.

NSS volunteers took up a tree plantation drive on July 27, 2007 on Kolhe Nagar area & on Aug. 13, 2007 near Lokmat Bhavan, Jalgaon.

After the Ganesh Festival was over, on Sept. 24, 2007 N. S. S. volunteers collected "Nirmalya" from temples in village Tarsod with the help of the villagers. The same was buried in trenches instead of the water bodies as is the tradition. The villagers were educated about the pollution it can cause to the water.

N. S. S. volunteers on Oct. 1, 2007 conducted a workshop on "personal & public hygiene" for the benefit of the primary school student at village Tarsod.

A rally was organized by about 100 college students on Dec. 1, 2007 in village Takarkheda to educate people about AIDS. The students also enacted a “drama” to put across the message.

An AIDS awareness programme was organized in the college campus on Dec. 13, 2007 by N. S. S. & the staff from Civil Hospital, Jalgaon. A majority of the college students attended.

Computer Science Department of the college regularly conducts “Computer Literacy & Internet Programme” for the benefit of students & teachers. This year the dept. conducted “Internet access & training” course for 08 batches that covered 111 students, each batch consisting of 15 students.

28. Financial aid to students :

Economically challenged students are identified and assigned some job in the library, college office and laboratories. The timing is so adjusted that normal college schedule of the students is not disturbed. This year 40 students got benefited under the scheme. An amount of Rs. 41,628/- was spent for the purpose.

2. Parents felt the need of a spacious playground in the college.
3. They desired that the reading rooms in the library be made more spacious
4. Many more vocational subjects should be introduced.
